# Church Rocks & Shiny Pebbles



Armistice Day is on **11 November** and is also known as Remembrance Day. It marks the day World War One ended, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month, in 1918. A two-minute silence is held at 11am to remember the people who have died in wars.

The symbol of remembrance is the poppy. It is a symbol to remember those who have given their lives in war. In the days leading up to Remembrance Sunday, you will see people in the streets and on television wearing a poppy.





The reason poppies are used as a symbol of remembrance is because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War One ended. Since then, they have come to be symbol of remembering not just those who gave their lives in World War One, but all those who have died on behalf of their country
