If you would like to spread the cost of Christmas Fayre spending, Freda will have these vouchers at 50p each, every Sunday. It really does help!




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## Church Rocks & Shiny Pebbles



Imagine having a baby, realising something is wrong and then receiving a diagnosis of a chromosome or gene disorder, only to be told by the doctors that they don't know what the future holds and can't answer your many questions.

#### Our Mission

To raise vital funds for a charity very close to our heart and to raise awareness of rare genetic disorders. Having a child with a rare genetic disorder can be a huge shock and can stir up a whole range of emotions yet there's a great desire to learn more about the disorder and knowing where to turn for support is daunting.

June 17th – 23rd 2018 is the **5th Global Rare Chromosome Disorder Awareness Week**. So here we are spreading the word about chromosome disorders and more importantly, UNIQUE; a charity whose mission is to inform, support and alleviate the isolation of anyone affected by a rare chromosome disorder.

UNIQUE is a small charity, totally dependent on voluntary donations and fundraising. The charity provides specialist information and support to families coming to terms with a diagnosis and to the medical professionals caring for them.

#### Our Why

Max was born in June 2015 after an uneventful pregnancy and birth. From an early age Max was troubled with numerous chest infections resulting in endless hospital visits. At only 4 months old Max contracted Bronchiolitis and Pneumonia at 7 months old. Via Pediatric intervention from our amazing consultant at the Hospital, Max underwent various tests, which thankfully ruled out a number of significant known disorders. In April 2017 we received a call from the consultant to explain that something had been picked up on one of Max's blood tests which would explain his low immune system and the fact that Max struggled to meet his baby milestones. We were invited into the hospital the following day to discuss the results and were given the overwhelming news that Max has a chromosome deletion, a rare genetic condition – so rare in fact it doesn't actually have a name. The consultant had to digest information from a UNIQUE leaflet to understand the condition enough to allow him to explain the diagnosis to us.

During the months that followed we saw a genetics specialist at Manchester Children's Hospital and Max now sees a range of health professionals to monitor his ongoing health and development complications. Thankfully we are in touch with some fantastic consultants however at best, their knowledge of his condition is very limited and there are no straightforward expectations or approaches we can rely on.

Through our connections with UNIQUE we have been able to understand more about Max's genetic deletion and have access to other families around the world who are on a very similar journey.

Max is almost 3 years old and even though we have faced a harsh reality that he might not walk or talk, he is now walking, has a very limited vocabulary but is able to communicate with us via speech or sign. He has the most infectious personality and touches the hearts of everyone he meets. He recently had a Gastrostomy fitted at Manchester children's hospital due to his poor intake of food but we're hopeful that this will be a temporary measure and whilst we're unsure what the future holds for us all we're determined that Max will continue to lead as normal life as possible with the support of the amazing family, friends and professionals he has around him.
