Editorial

The Acts of the Apostles is one of the most fascinating books in the bible. It tells the story of the church's transformation from a regional broken faith called Judaism to a worldwide faith that follows Jesus. Jesus spoke about a glimpse of what the first disciples of the new church would be up to for the rest of their lives. Traveling beyond their limited parochial preferences of faith to places and ideas never imagined. Jesus didn't speak in grandiose terms. In fact, he was specific about what was going to happen to this little sect of Galilean Jews who spent three years following him. It wasn't going to be easy. Almost everything happens in the Book of Acts by the power of the Holy Spirit. The book could more accurately be called the Acts of the Holy Spirit. There is no human power or gain, no creative thought on the part of the disciples, necessarily. It's more like the disciples had no choice. The implications are unlimited and wild when it comes to tearing down the human barriers we build between full participation in the church's life and those who are different from us, whether by race, gender preference, genetics, culture, physical handicap, or even political opinion. The Holy Spirit will not be limited by the narrowness of human prejudice
