
Church Rocks & Shiny Pebbles



The Feast of Epiphany is on 6 January. It marks the end of the 12 days of Christmas and celebrates the visit of the Wise Men to the baby Jesus. They wanted to find Jesus so that they could worship and honour him. God gave them a star to guide them which led them right to Jesus. These men, often called Kings or Magi, brought valuable gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to honour the baby and bowed down and worshipped him.

The gift of gold was the gift people usually gave to their King. By giving gold they were recognising Jesus as their King. The second gift, frankincense, is a white gum from a tree which when hardened will burn giving off a fragrant smell. It was burnt as an offering to God during worship, used as a medicine and a perfume. The third gift, myrrh, also a gum from thorny tree was used for healing wounds because it is antiseptic, soothes redness and relieves pain.

People today are still seeking Jesus. However we don't need to look for him in Bethlehem because he is no longer there - he is on his throne in Heaven. We don't even need a star to help us find him; we can find Him by reading God's Holy Word. The Holy Bible leads us to Jesus.
