## **Editorial**

The subject of prayer is often raised in Church and in conversation. Sometimes I hear people say, "I would pray more often, but I don't know how to", or "I don't know where to start." Prayer can take many forms: formally-prayers being read out loud in Church with responses, reading prayers from a prayer book, joining a prayer group and contributing to the group with a prayer, private prayer, with family or a friend, or completely private prayer - just a quiet conversation with God. The latter is my preferred option. But like all conversations, there has to be some sort of structure. Here is a little trick I learned a little while ago and now I use it all the time. The abbreviation for teaspoon in all recipes is tsp. . But the most useful of all is in prayer the TSP -

T= "Thank you Father for all your blessings in my life", "for answering my prayer", "for the wonders of your creation", in fact anything you to give thanks for.

**S=** "Sorry Father for being stubborn, thoughtless, quick to judge others, putting things off", or whatever you feel you need to say sorry for.

P= "Please Father, I ask for healing for my friend/my child/my relative etc" or any other concern you have that you want God's help with

You don't have to pray out loud if you don't want to, you don't need fancy or special words, for God hears our silent prayers too and knows what is in our heart.


Please try to support the social and fundraising events as they are vital not only to the financial wellbeing of our Church, but are great opportunities to get to know one another better.

St Swithun's day if thou dost rain For forty days it will remain St Swithun's day if thou be fair For forty days 'twill rain nae mare



According to tradition, whatever the weather is like on St Swithin's Day – whether rainy or sunny – it will continue for the next 40 days and 40 nights. St Swithin's Day falls on July 15.

This is a fundraising opportunity for St Bede Church. You may wish to pledge an amount for each day that it rains for the 40 days following St Swithin's Day on 15 July. For example, if it rains for 10 days during the 40 days, and you pledge to pay £1 for each day that it rains, then the amount you would pay at the end would be £10. Pledge slips are available at the back of church for you to complete and then return to either Carol or Gill. We will keep a record of the weather during the St Swithin's pledge and let you know the amount you have pledged at the end of August. Thank you for your continued support.
