# A Special Editorial

When Pat and I with Matthew and Jonathan first came to St Bede's in September of 1988, we never for one-minute thought God would have us stay here till 2019 and beyond, 31 years presently. When we arrived, I was 39 and had hair! Pat and I thank God for bringing us here, for it has been a lesson of patience and of gratitude. Patience for we were both Readers then and I had felt a call to ordination since my late teens! I began to accept that perhaps God had withdrawn the call to ordination and I fully accepted my ministry as Reader, however, there was a nagging call for ordination which would not go away! After wrestling with this for a long time I was sent to The Revd. Julia Davies, who was Assistant Director of Ordinand's, I was not at all minded to attend another selection conference, having been to two over a 25-year period. Long story shortened, I was accepted for training, Bishop Nigel was prepared to ordain me having only been on the course for only one year, taking into account my age, previous training and 30 years' service as a Reader. I was ordained in July 2012. Here I am 7 years later at the age of 70 and taking 'retirement' (for the second time, the first in 2003 from full time paid employment with Bolton Council).

It's scary, time seems to have whizzed by! But from accepting Christ back in the late 1960's, and our marriage in 1973, Pat and I have been walking God's highway accompanied and guided by His Holy Spirit and every step has been God led, so exciting and reassuring. It is surreal and strange to be on the threshold of 'retirement' for the second time, however, as Arnie says, 'I'll be back!'. I and Pat will take 6 months sabbatical (time off for good behaviour!?) and return in February 2020, to resume 'lighter duties!'

Thank you all at St Bede's for being such a loving, warm and welcoming fellowship. Your friendship, encouragement and support have played a big part in God's call for Pat and I to minister amongst you in the Parish. Our thanks, prayers and love go out to you all, for the huge part you have all played in God's call to minister in St Bede's.

Again, thanks and blessings to you, God's people, past, present and future, who have given us your love and support in Jesus Name.

## St Swithin's Fundraiser Pledge



St Swithun's day if thou dost rain For forty days it will remain St Swithun's day if thou be fair For forty days 'twill rain nae mare



According to tradition, whatever the weather is like on St Swithin's Day – whether rainy or sunny – it will continue for the next 40 days and 40 nights. St Swithin's Day falls on July 15.

This is a fundraising opportunity for St Bede Church. You may wish to pledge an amount for each day that it rains for the 40 days following St Swithin's Day on 15 July. For example, if it rains for 10 days during the 40 days, and you pledge to pay £1 for each day that it rains, then the amount you would pay at the end would be £10. **Pledge slips are available at the back of church for you to complete** and then return to either Carol or Gill. We will keep a record of the weather during the St Swithin's pledge and let you know the amount you have pledged at the end of August. Thank you for your continued support.
