GO IN JESUS' NAME



'After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.' Luke 10:1-2

In today's Gospel reading from Luke, Chapter 10, Jesus sent out workers to tell others about God. He told them exactly what they should do and sent them out with everything they needed to be successful. Testimony of Paul Braddock - St Andrews

How does the Holy Spirit help me to pray?

The sermon series we are doing at St Andrews 10.45 service is focused on prayer. So, Vinny has asked me to share how the Holy Spirit helps me to pray but then asked for an example. So I'm going to share with you my testimony and then share how the Holy Spirit helps me to pray if that's ok?

A lot of you will know that I've been coming to St Andrews all my life, coming with my mum and dad, then more through habit once I left high school. I got to a point in my life, about 24, where I heard someone or something say to me in my head, "what you are doing is wrong, turn back". It was a bit weird because I was driving at the time. But I was like what was that all about? I ignored it and carried on. It was only later that it hit me what it meant, what I had done or doing and the fear of Gods wrath struck me, I was petrified, I've never been so scared to the point where I was shaking. I didn't know what to do. I knew it was something supernatural, something Godly that I had just experienced, like I'd never experienced before. So, I thought if there is a God then I best find out about it. Coming to St Andrews I thought I would start with what I kind of know, by reading the Bible and to read it in a year, just to see what it's all about. This was January so it was ideal to read the Bible in a year. During that time, I believe God started to soften my heart and open my eyes by reading the Bible. August came and I was still reading the Bible and still feared Gods wrath. Julian Tomlinson, John & Jackie's son invited me to a Christian festival, called Momentum. I was apprehensive about it all but accepted. On arrival, something instantly made me feel like I was home. A few days later at one of the services they called people forward if they wanted prayer, so I went as I believed I needed it. I knew I had fallen short of Gods glory and sought repentance for my past. I opened my hands and surrendered to God, asking for this in prayer. Within a few minutes I experienced peace like never before. I felt a massive weight had be lifted from my shoulders. Then a heavenly being spoke to me, clear as day. The same words from Jesus baptism. Mark 1 v11. It reads "And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."" Those same words were spoken to me. It didn't feel right because I knew them from Jesus baptism. But at that point I wept, I remember saying "How can you love me and be pleased with me after what I've done?" I knew then that I had been in the presence of God, Gods peace poured over me, that verse was confirmation that the Holy Spirit was at work in my life, the weight being lifted off my shoulders was Jesus forgiving me and taking away my sin. That same peace that I experienced that evening sat upon me for at least 3 weeks after and is still with me now. From then on I haven't been able to get Jesus out of my heard, and why would I want to? After what I had just experienced? I know now that he is the way, the truth and the life.

That is my testimony of how I came to have a relationship with Christ and how God was at work in my life.

So, to answer the first question, how does the Holy Spirit help me to pray?

I get triggers or nudges, some small, medium, large or whatever t-shirt size you want. These can happen subconsciously or consciously. They can be from a reading from the Bible, it could be something that I've experienced or seen that makes me think I need to pray for this person, that situation or indeed for myself. Without those triggers or nudges I wouldn't bat an eye lid and would carry on in my own little world.

I've found that God responds in many different ways. I've personally experienced God revealing himself to me, similar to my testimony, a supernatural experience. Then there are other ways he speaks to me, it can be through scripture, worship song, conversation with other people or other people's actions that have then made me be in awe and go WOW, was that really you God?

Don't think that this happens every time I pray, sometimes there is no immediate response, just like those months leading up to me attending Momentum. But I know God is listening and that Gods timing is perfect.

As you have received, so may you be pleased to give.

St Bede's is a living Church and its people are The Church. The Church's only financial support is its own Church family.


Please try to support the social and fundraising events as they are vital not only to the financial wellbeing of our Church, but are great opportunities to get to know one another better.

St Swithin's Fundraiser Pledge



St Swithun's day if thou dost rain For forty days it will remain St Swithun's day if thou be fair For forty days 'twill rain nae mare



According to tradition, whatever the weather is like on St Swithin's Day – whether rainy or sunny – it will continue for the next 40 days and 40 nights. St Swithin's Day falls on July 15.

This is a fundraising opportunity for St Bede Church. You may wish to pledge an amount for each day that it rains for the 40 days following St Swithin's Day on 15 July. For example, if it rains for 10 days during the 40 days, and you pledge to pay £1 for each day that it rains, then the amount you would pay at the end would be £10.

Pledge slips are available at the back of church for you to complete and then return to either Carol or Gill. We will keep a record of the weather during the St Swithin's pledge and let you know the amount you have pledged at the end of August. Thank you for your continued support.
