

Tony's Training Update – Reader Ministry Training

I thought that this week was an ideal opportunity to give everyone an update on where I am up to in my Reader Ministry Training.

I have successfully completed my 1st module – Introduction to Christian Worship in which I achieved a PASS. The module aim was to explore how to lead worship by crafting a service. During the journey I explored the ways in which our use of music, the bible, and the seasons of the year, shape our worship.

Worship holds up a mirror to what we believe which is why the Church of England has rules about public worship. We looked at the Eucharist and ways in which our communities might be more inclusive.

Today, I am attending my 2nd Reader Study Day at The All Saints Centre for Mission & Ministry in Warrington, on the Chester University Campus. These study days are focused on one of my modules; Foundations for Ministry & Mission on Context. In these sessions we will look at what is required of ministers of the Gospel and what are the implications of this? We then look at the biblical and theological foundations of lay and ordained ministries and then what skills of analysis, reflection, collaboration and leadership might I need in my ministry?

I have just started my 2nd Thursday night module on; Introduction to Preaching. This module is designed to help preachers explore and develop understanding, knowledge and practice of preaching in pastoral contexts. Sessions include taking a look at the how the content of sermons might be identified and shaped through exegesis and imagination, how congregations play a role in preaching and how we grow in understanding of ourselves as preachers.

Although there is a lot of work and getting back into writing assignments has been tough, I am thoroughly enjoying the course and am looking forward to developing in my ministry.
