### **Editorial**

Traditionally, readers of the Psalms have tried to treat them historic, and thus tried to connect each psalm with a specific situation in the life of Israel.

For example, Psalms 42-43 tell of someone's exile; Psalm 44 tells of some military defeat; Psalm 45 tells of some royal marriage; Psalm 46 tells if some invasion and deliverance. But which exile, which defeat, marriage or invasion do they relate to? Commentators try to work it out, but they differ in their conclusions because within the psalms there's no way of telling. That conclusion applies to Psalm in general (Ps 137 is the nearest to an exception, since it explicitly refers to exile.)

Given that there isn't a structure to the Psalter itself, one way of getting a feel for the Psalter as a whole is to collect the examples of the different types of psalms; praise, hymns, poems, prayers or protests and thanksgiving or testimonies.

## News...

St Bede's Church is now open for worship! Obviously, we will need to follow new guidelines and do things slightly differently in church from now on. We have done a thorough risk assessment and done all we can to ensure we as a church are COVID-19 secure. The changes include:

- People entering church will be asked to use sanitising hand gel as they enter the building
- You will need to keep 2 metres distance from others at all times this means only half the pews will be in use and we will ask you to sit at the end of the pew so to maintain 2 metres from other people.
- There will be no singing of hymns as singing is not permitted
- No service sheets/hymn books will be given out as all the liturgy will be on our new screen at the front of church
- The Government advises that people who are at risk (i.e. those with underlying health conditions, those shielding and those over 70 years of age) do not come to church at the moment. However ultimately it is your choice.
- We will not be signing attendance forms for church school admissions so there is no need to bring your sheets to be signed each week. We are waiting for schools to re-evaluate their admissions criteria in the light of churches being closed over recent months.
- Communion is permitted, but we will only be distributing the bread.
- The Wardens will be noting down attendees at each church service, so that if there is a positive case of COVID-19 at church, NHS Test and Trace can be notified.
- If you have attended a service at St Bede's and you have a positive test of COVID-19, then you should inform Vinny or the Wardens immediately.

Our Wardens will be taking a note of who attends and will be passing this information onto the NHS Track & Trace service should we have anyone who tests positive for COVID19. If you DO NOT wish to have your information passed on, please see Gill or Jean


