A thought from Ben Wilkinson - Curate @ Deane

"Stay Safe"

"Stay safe." How many times have we said that so far this year? It's probably the most repeated phrase of 2020, almost the new "good bye". But what are we trusting to keep us safe?

The top answer in the UK is almost certainly the NHS: the doctors, nurses, hospitals, paramedics and support staff. I have been in regular contact with several doctors and nurses in our local churches during this pandemic and all of them have been working extremely hard. They have put their own lives and the lives of their own family members at risk by doing their jobs.

The NHS is a gift of God to this country. The first hospitals in this country were set up by Christians and the whole idea of the NHS seems to have been inspired by the commitment of many Christian people to care for others. We give thanks for the NHS.

But there is a problem – even with the NHS – and we need to be aware of this. The NHS cannot keep us truly safe. In the end, the NHS cannot save us from death. It might be able to delay or death by a few years or even a few decades, but it cannot keep us truly safe from death.

So where can we turn? In Mark's Gospel we read about a woman who realised that the doctors could no longer help her (Mark 5v21-34). "When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, because she thought, "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed."

She reaches out to Jesus as her only hope. She's confident that he has the power to heal her. Does he really? Let's read on... "Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering."

It raises the question "who is this man?" He has such power to heal, far more than any doctor. And it's complete and immediate and it gives wholeness of life.

The answer is that Jesus is God. God the healer, God the saviour, God the life-giver. Jesus not only has the power to heal, but he's also full of compassion. "At once Jesus realized that power had gone out from him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my clothes?"... Then the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell at his feet and, trembling with fear, told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."

Jesus makes it clear that it wasn't so much the physical touch as reaching out with faith in Jesus that made this woman well. And the same thing is true today: Billions of people know about Jesus. I guess billions of people have some kind of contact with the message of Jesus. But we need to do more than that. We need to trust him. We need to reach out to him in faith, knowing that he is the only one who can keep us truly safe.

Not even the NHS can keep us truly safe. Wonderful as it is. Only Jesus can do that for us.

I'd like to close with some words that a doctor friend of mine wrote earlier in this crisis. His name is Monty Lyman and he's a skin specialist working on Oxford. His book on skin was Radio 4's "Book of the week" earlier this year. In March, Monty was redeployed to the COVID ward of his hospital and a few weeks later he had a bad bout of coronavirus himself.

At that time Monty wrote this:

"In his ministry, Jesus gave hope to those with broken bodies by healing the sick, but this temporary relief pointed to healing from an even greater illness. Jesus came to forgive sins and offer eternal life, and through his death on the cross and resurrection believers have – despite living in a time of broken bodies and anxious minds – a certain, eternal hope."




