Holy Habit 7: Eating Together Suggested Reading: Luke 14:

15-24 (25th October)

"Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together" (Acts 2: 46)

In recent times there has been a rediscovery of table fellowship within Christianity. In the early church, eating together, whether in homes or at church, was a time of blessing. Not only was the invitation to come and eat a demonstration of love and grace; but as people talked and shared together around the table and prayed together - the dinner table became a vital place where people grew deeper in their discipleship. Even today; table fellowship is a vital component of the Alpha Course and Messy Church. Have you ever considered being a school governor?

Being a school governor is a challenging but hugely rewarding role. It will give you the chance to make a real difference to young people, give something back to your local community and use and develop your skills in a school environment. You will also be joining the largest volunteer force in the country: there are over a quarter of a million volunteers governing schools in England.

Schools need governing boards that have a balance and diversity of knowledge, skills and experience to enable it to be effective. Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has repeatedly noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management – which includes the governing board. In Academy Trusts like St Bede Primary Multi Academy Trust of which our school is a founding member of, the governing body is referred to as a Local Governing Body or LGB.

Who can become a school governor?

Anyone aged 18 or over can be a governor (but there are some exceptions) and you do not need to be a parent. There is no requirement for you to have an understanding of the education system, just the necessary skills, character and time to contribute. There is plenty of training available to help you learn about education. Schools needs and benefit from a range of professional knowledge on their governing board including education, finance, human resources, legal, marketing and public relations, property and estates management, and organisational change.

I am specifically looking for people with some experience in either Law, Local Authority, behaviour or special educational needs, but I will speak to anyone who is interested.






JUBILEE AND COMMUNITY ROOMS
