'There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light so that through him all men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.' John 1:6-8



The bible reading for today tells us that God sent a man, John the Baptist, to tell about the light, Jesus, so that everyone would believe. John was not the light. He only came to tell others about the light. Jesus in the one true light, who gives light to everyone.

At this time of year, we see lights everywhere that reminds us of the coming of Jesus, the true light that John told about. Those lights can help us remember that Jesus is the one true light in our hearts and in our lives and reminds us that Jesus brought light into the darkness of this world.
