Church Rocks & Shiny Pebbles



'After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."' Matthew 2:1-2 (NIV)

We read in today's Gospel reading from Matthew 2:1-12, God sent a star to tell of Jesus' birth. The Magi did not have a map to follow to travel the long distance to Bethlehem, so they followed the star. They brought with them gifts of Gold (*a gift given to a king*), Frankincense (*an incense which has a pleasant smell and is burned during worship - a gift given to a priest*) and Myrrh (*something they used to prepare a body for the grave - a gift for someone going to die*).

Just like the Magi, people still search for Jesus today, but there is no star to follow. Therefore how can people find their way to Jesus today? THE BIBLE. This is the map and the star that will lead to Jesus. When we find Jesus, we don't have gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. So what can we give? Our gifts to Jesus are our love, our worship and our life to tell others what Jesus' birth, death and rising again means for them.
