Challenges and Future Plans at St Bedes

Vinny writes...In Moses' encounter with God at the burning bush; God asks Moses 'What is that in your hand' (Exodus 4:2). All that Moses has in his hand is an ordinary staff. Yet as Moses offers his staff to God in faith; God in his awesome power uses the staff to work Out his amazing plans and purposes.

I would like to take this opportunity to share with you, our church family at St Bedes, some of the challenges we face but also some of the exciting future plans we have for St Bedes; so we can pray together and discern where God is leading us.



The Challenge

We have been incredibly blessed at St Bedes that many of you have continued to faithfully give financially to support the ministry and mission of St Bedes and personally I want to thank you for your continued support.

However the Covid-19 pandemic has had a financial impact on us all including ourselves as a church and as a Diocese. Social restrictions have meant we have missed out on doing many of our social/fundraising events and as a result for 2021 so far St Bedes Church has a shortfall of £3,000. This means we also have no money to do much needed upgrades to the church building and facilities at St Bedes for example replacing the sound system (which we have been quoted £6,000+ to replace).

As a church, we are not alone in this financial challenge. In 2020 Manchester Diocese made a loss of £3 million. This already means there are major consequences which will impact on our mission and ministry at St Bedes. All churches in the Diocese are being restructured into Mission Communities where we are being asked to work in larger teams and there will be less stipendiary (paid full time) clergy available. At the moment the plan is for St Bedes to be part of a Mission Community which consists of 14 churches (Horwich, Westhoughton + Deane) with an allocation of 5 stipendiary clergy.

Future Plans

Despite the challenges we face; I am excited and confident about the future and we have so much to be thankful for at St Bedes. We have a new curate, Ben, who has settled in well to life here at St Bedes. Our children's ministry is restarting and we are able to do social events again which are an important part of engaging with our wider community. Our Going Deeper Group will be returning soon and we have a growing number of opportunities to engage with our wider community through our church school, St Bedes Academy.

As we enter a new season I believe God has so much more in store for us at St Bedes. Yet each one of us needs to play our part in God's plans and purposes and we need to be willing to offer to God what is in our hand; whether that is our time, our resources and our money so that future generations of people in Morris Green can hear the good news of Jesus.

Please continue to pray about the challenges and also the exciting future plans we have here at St Bedes and how you might respond in faith

Collection Plate

Some people prefer to make a donation through the collection plate. Currently we do not pass round the collection plate during the service but you can place envelopes and money donations on the collection plate at the back of church. If you pay tax, please could we encourage you to use gift aid envelopes. This enables us to claim an extra 25% from the Government.



Card Machine

As a result of the pandemic many of us prefer to use card payments rather than carry cash with us. At St Bedes we have a card reader at the back of church near the collection plate which you can tap your card in order to make a set donation of £3 or £5.

One off Donations

If you would like to make a one off donation; there are envelopes available at the back of church.

Supporting Fundraising Events

Finally, turning up and supporting our many fundraising events through the year such as the Christmas Fayre, makes a real difference to your church.
