Editorial


EPIPHANY

Matthew 2:1–12 speaks powerfully into today's world of power, fear, and searching for meaning. Like Herod, modern leaders and systems can feel threatened by anything that challenges control, status, or self-interest, often responding with anxiety rather than openness to truth.

The religious leaders' indifference mirrors how faith today can become theoretical—well informed but inactive—when comfort replaces commitment. In contrast, the Magi reflect many people in today's global, diverse society who are sincerely searching for truth, even outside traditional religious boundaries.

Their willingness to journey, give generously, and worship challenges modern cultures of convenience and consumerism. The star reminds us that God still draws people in unexpected ways, using circumstances, questions, and restlessness to lead them toward Christ. The passage invites today's world to consider how we respond to Jesus: with fear, apathy, or worship. True faith, then as now, requires action, humility, and obedience.

Sunday 11th January


10am Holy Communion

A REFLECTION

As 2026 unfolds, it invites reflection on how faith speaks into a rapidly changing, often uncertain world. One key line of enquiry is where we are placing our trust: in stability, success, and control, or in God's enduring presence. Another reflection concerns attention and listening—how do we create space for God amid constant noise, speed, and distraction?

2026 also invites questions about faith in action. How does belief shape our responses to inequality, conflict, environmental responsibility, and care for the vulnerable? Rather than asking only "What do I believe?", we might ask, "How is my faith transforming the way I live and treat others?"

A further enquiry is *hope*. In a world marked by anxiety and division, what does Christian hope look like in daily life, and how can it be shared without words? Finally, 2026 encourages reflection on *community*: how can churches and individuals become places of welcome, honesty, and healing? These questions do not demand quick answers but invite prayerful, ongoing engagement with God.

TEXT VERSE FOR 2026

As we move into 2026; we also have a new text card!

Our verse for 2026 is 'Remember, there is only one foundation, the one already laid, Jesus Christ' (1 Corinthians 3:11)

This verse reminds us and calls us that we need to make Jesus the sure foundation of who we are and all that we do in our lives.


